

fair isle beanie

Designed by Monica Russel

This is a great unisex hat that will complement the scarf, snood and wrist cuffs. The hat fits snuggly over the ears and will keep you warm on a chilly day.

Yarn

3 x 50g balls (94m/103yds) Rooster Almerino Aran (50% baby alpaca/50% merino wool)

Yarn A: 320 Silver x 1 ball

Yarn B: 308 Spiced Plum x 1 ball

Yarn C: 309 Ocean x 1 ball

Needles

1 pair of 4.5mm (UK 7/ US 7) singlepointed needles 1 pair of 5mm (UK 6/ US 8) singlepointed needles 1 tapestry needle

Size

To fit an average sized adult head

Tension

22sts and 21rows to 10cm (4in) square using fair isle pattern and 5mm (US 8) knitting needles.



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Abbreviations

RS right side

WS wrong side

KTBL knit through the back of the stitch to form a neat/ tighter edge when using a traditional cast on

K knit

P purl

sts stitches

K2tog Knit 2 together to decrease a stitch

Hat pattern

Using 4.5mm needles and colour A cast on 104 sts

Next row: KTBL

Rows 1-26: *K1, P1, rep from * to end of row

Change to 5mm needles

Main Pattern

Rows 1–2: st colour B

Use Chart A

Read the chart from right to left on knit rows (odd numbered rows) and from left to right on even nubered rows.

Row 1: K1C, work stitches 1-6 from the chart x 17, K1C

Row 2: P1C, work sts 6-1 from chart x 17, then P1B

Row 3: K1C, work from stitches 1-6 from chart x 17, K1B

Row 4: P1B, work from stitches 6-1 from the chart x 17, P1C

Rows 5-6: : st colour B

Now Work From Chart B as Follows using C as main and A as 2nd colour

Row 1: K2A, work from stitches 1–10 x 10, K2C

Row 2: P2C, work from stitches 10-1 x 10, P2C

Row 3: K2A, work from stitches 1-10 from chart x 10, K2A

Row 4: P2A, work from stitches 10-1 x 10, P2C

Row 5: K2A, work from stitches 1-10 from chart x 10, K1C, K1A

Row 6: P2A, work from stitches $10-1 \times 10$, P1C, P1A

Row 7: As row 1

Row 8: As row 2

Row 9: As row 3

Row 10: As row 4

Row 11: K1A, K1C, work from stitches 1–10 from chart x 10,

K1C, K1A

Row 12: P2C, work from stitches 10-1 x 10, P2A

Rows 13–14: st colour B

Rows 15-18: work as chart A, rows 1-4

Rows 19-20: st colour B

Rows 21–32: As rows 1–12 using chart B

Cut off yarns A and C

Row 33: Using colour B * K2tog, repeat from * until end of row

Row 34: Purl

Row 35: * K2tog, repeat from * until end of the row

Cut off yarn leaving a long end to thread through your remaining stitches.

Making Up


Draw up stitches and pull tightly and secure the top with a few stitches. Sew sides together using a mattress stitch with right sides facing until you reach the ribbed part. Fold the rib in half and sew the turned up part together with a mattress stitch with the wrong sides together (so that the seam does not show when the based is turned up)

Weave all loose ends into the rear of work.
